Grade 3-8 students proficient on ELA PSSA will grow from 35.7% in August 2019 to 65.0% by August 2026. Grades 3-8 students proficient on Math PSSA will grow from 3.7% in August 2019 to 35% by August 2026. At least 50% of all students will attend school 95% of days or more by August 2026.

Parents may also receive phone calls, text messages, and emails regarding their children's learning. For students who are receiving additional support and services, such as special education or ESOL, the parents will also receive communication from these teachers as well. Family Night will be held in the Fall to include families in learning activities surrounding literacy and math. Parent workshops are held monthly on literacy, math and attendance topics. The Book Fair is hosted two times each year to help parents expand their home libraries for the children. Additionally, Gideon school works with the Pre-K Program and local Early Childhood Development Centers for Kindergarten Open House and registrations.
